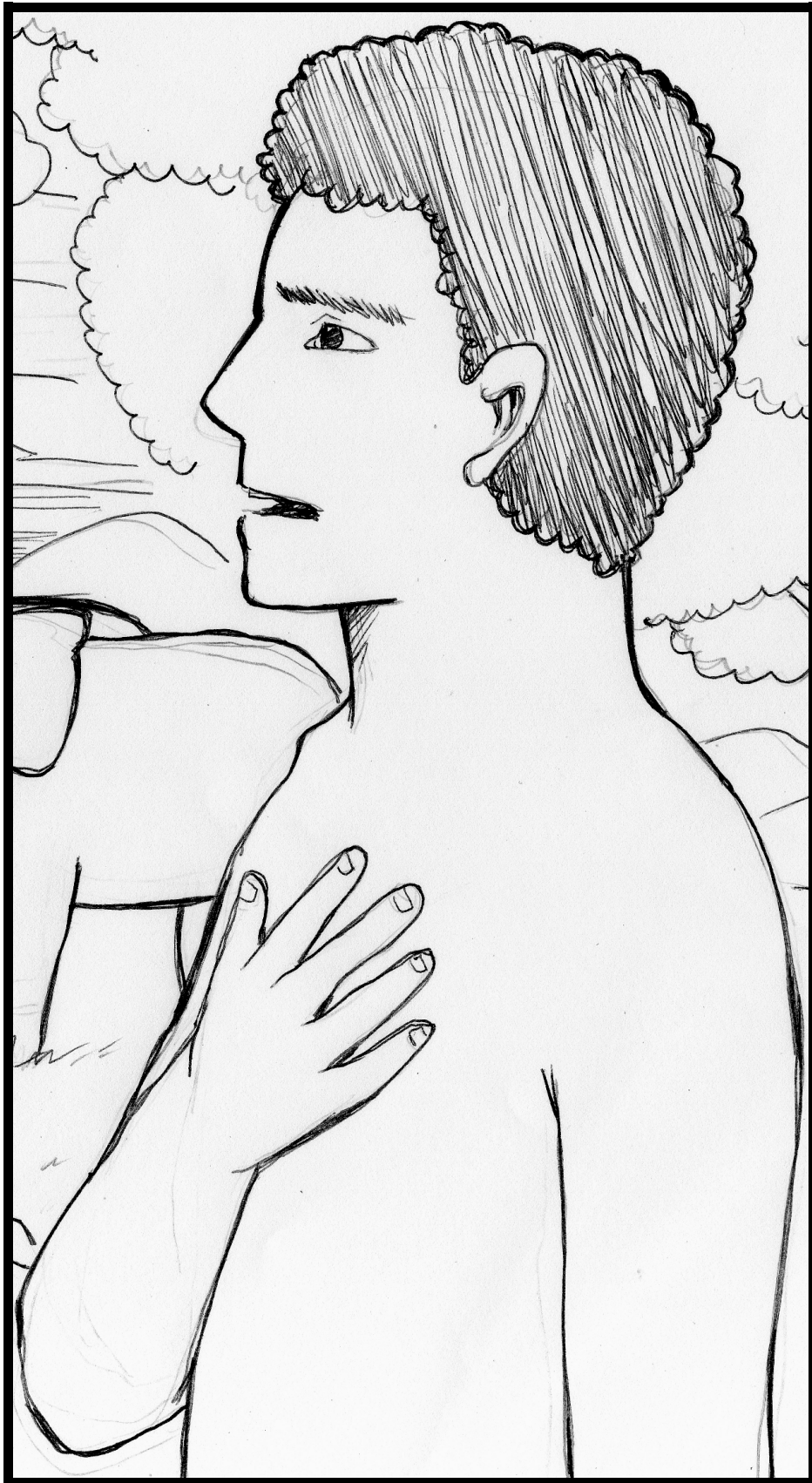


God's Desire For Those After His Kind



The Life Cycle of a Salmon

Salmon are born as eggs in fresh water springs. As the eggs hatch and the fish mature, they will adapt to salt water and swim to the ocean. The salmon will live in the ocean usually from one to eight years, depending on the type of salmon.

When they are ready to spawn they swim back to the springs where they were born. This journey can be several thousand miles filled with hazards such as swimming up rugged rapids, leaping over rocky waterfalls, being hunted by bears and other things.

When the mom and dad salmon finally reach the springs/streams and bring forth their children, they both die. They are exhausted, malnourished and the freshwater is now hurtful or even poisonous to them. They have gone on a remarkable journey with great sacrifice to be able bring forth their offspring. *(There are some types of salmon that survive to spawn more than once.)*

What a beautiful picture of how Jesus lives in us. As His Lamb nature grows in us we are able to go in the way of the Cross, against the normal flow of selfishness and hate... until we reach the place of laying our lives down for others to have life (11 Cor. 4:11-12). All Christians who reach maturity will experience the "Life cycle of the Lamb" whose nature is in us. The indwelling Life of Christ will inevitable carry us in the way of the Cross.

We are not becoming theologians or deep thinkers, we are being changed into His same image so that He can have those who are after His same kind (*11 Corinthians 3:18*).

May our beloved Jesus not feel alone in the midst of His Church. May He find the communion of His one Life filling all things. May all things emanate the very beauty of His nature and the savor of His Life.

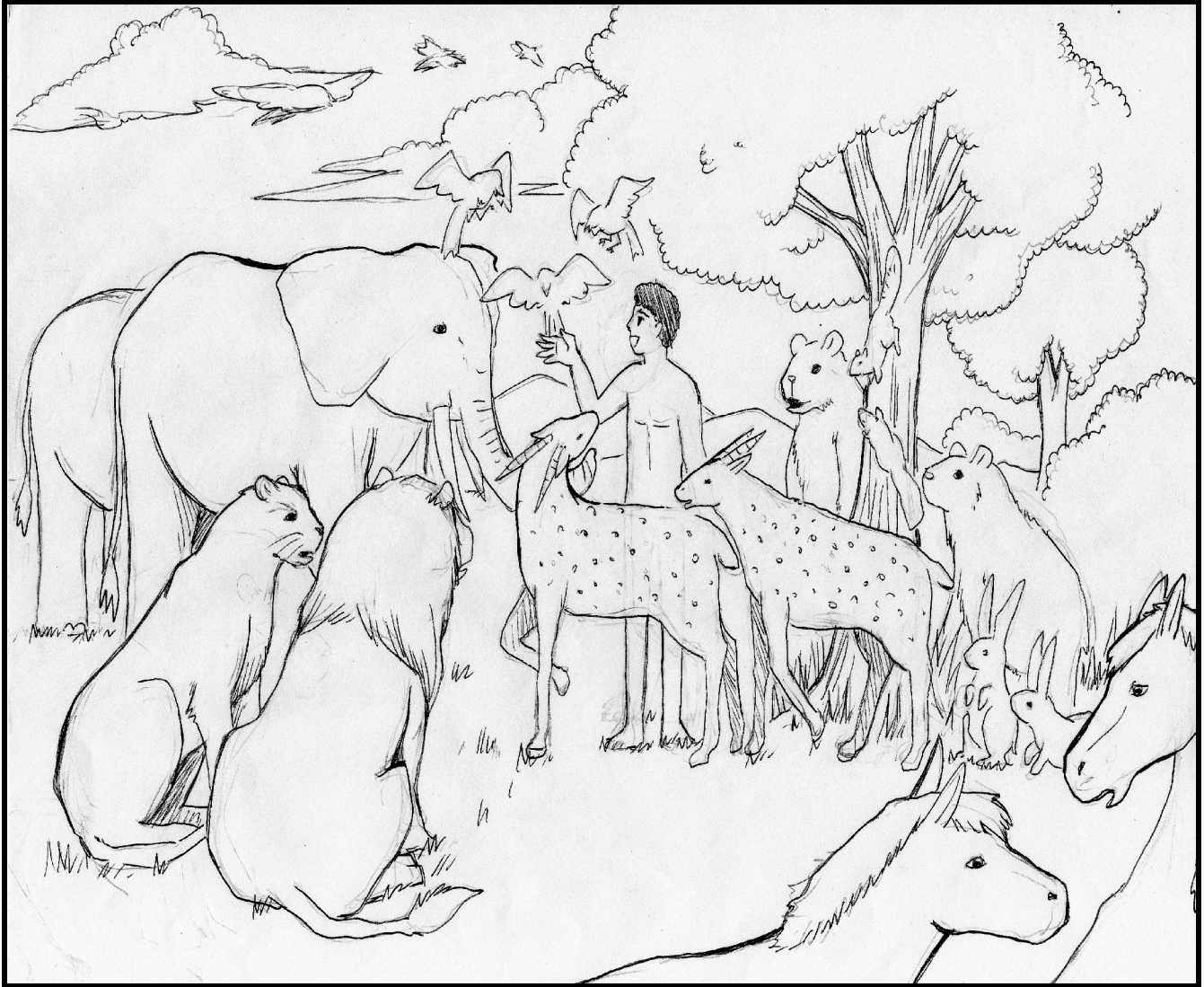
You may be wondering what Salmon have to do with all this! These fish are a wonderful picture of the effects of inward nature. Salmon are not trained to swim upstream. They are not given lessons on how to swim upstream and told what time to do it. God has put it in them, in their very nature, to behave in these ways and patterns. All species have their definitive kind of behavior based upon their nature.

The term "instinct" has been defined as; *"A stereotyped, or largely unvarying, behavior that is typical of a particular species. An instinct is the inborn pattern of behavior; the inherent disposition of a living organism toward a particular behavior. Instinctive behavior does not have to be learned."*

A goat is not taught to act selfishly and a lamb is not trained to be submissive at the time of its own slaughter. These creatures both act according to the natures they were born with. It is very "natural" for all of us to be self centered because we were born with the old sin nature (*Ephesians 2:3b*). A child does not have to be taught how to want its own way. Before a child even knows how to speak they know how to cry if denied a desire. Yet, through new birth, God has put in every born again believer the very nature of Christ, the Lamb of God. As we allow His Spirit and Life to form in us, we will find ourselves transformed. His reactions and attitudes will come forth in the form of Life as the result of a new nature. This is so much better than learning to display behaviors that are not the result of your innermost being. Salmon are able to overcome enormous obstacles as they swim upstream. The reason they swim is because of an inner drive that has been placed in them by God. God has put more than an instinct or inner drive in us, He has given us His Son and made us partakers of His divine nature (*1 Peter 1:4, 1 John 5:12*). We must continue to nurture the Life of Christ within until His Life is strong enough to carry us into the places of love and sacrifice that we would never go.

I pray that the Holy Spirit might speak to your heart through the foolishness of a kid's book, and draw your attention to the very heart of Jesus and His desires.

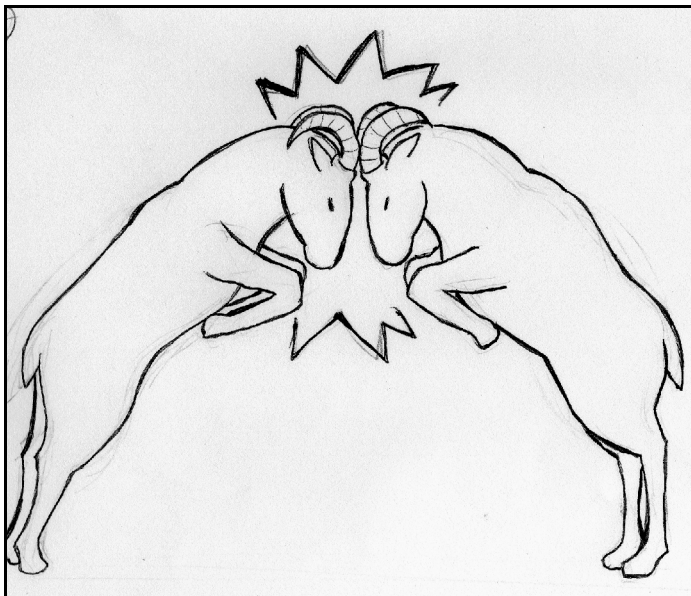
There were so many animals! There were birds that filled the sky, fish that filled the waters, and land creatures of every kind.

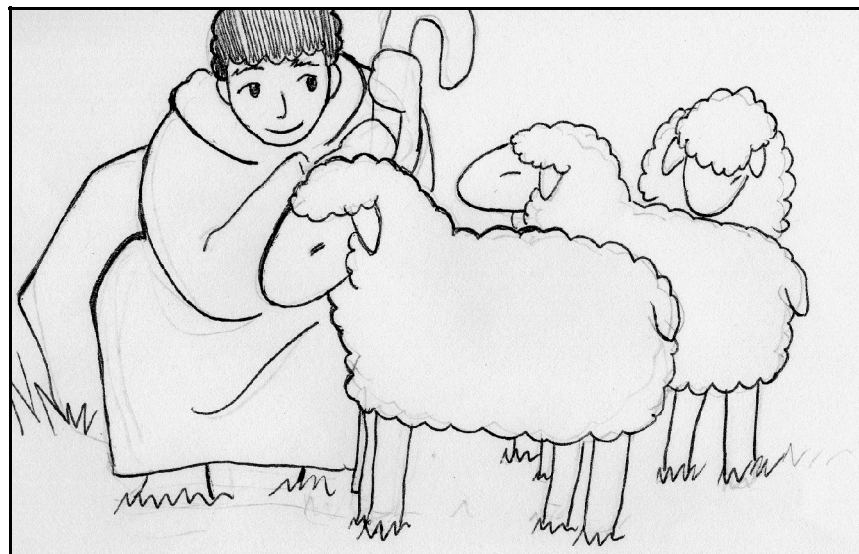

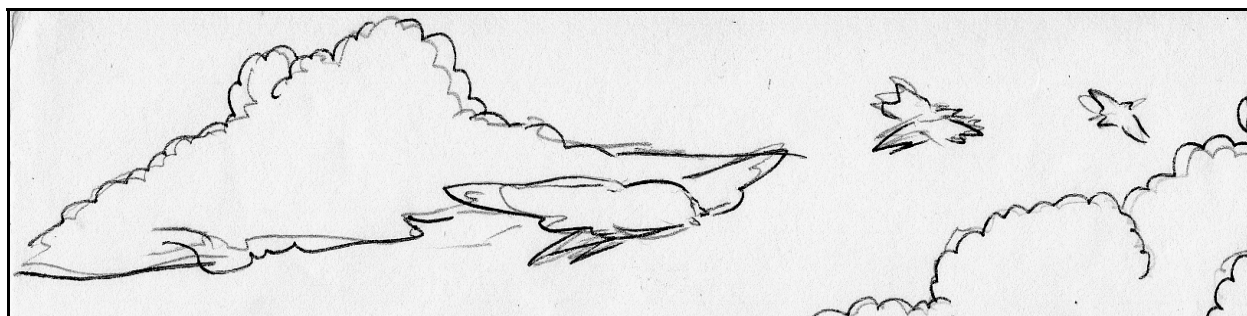


What if Adam watched the goats butting their heads together?

Goats just seem to fight and not get along, but the sheep are more peaceful and easy to lead.



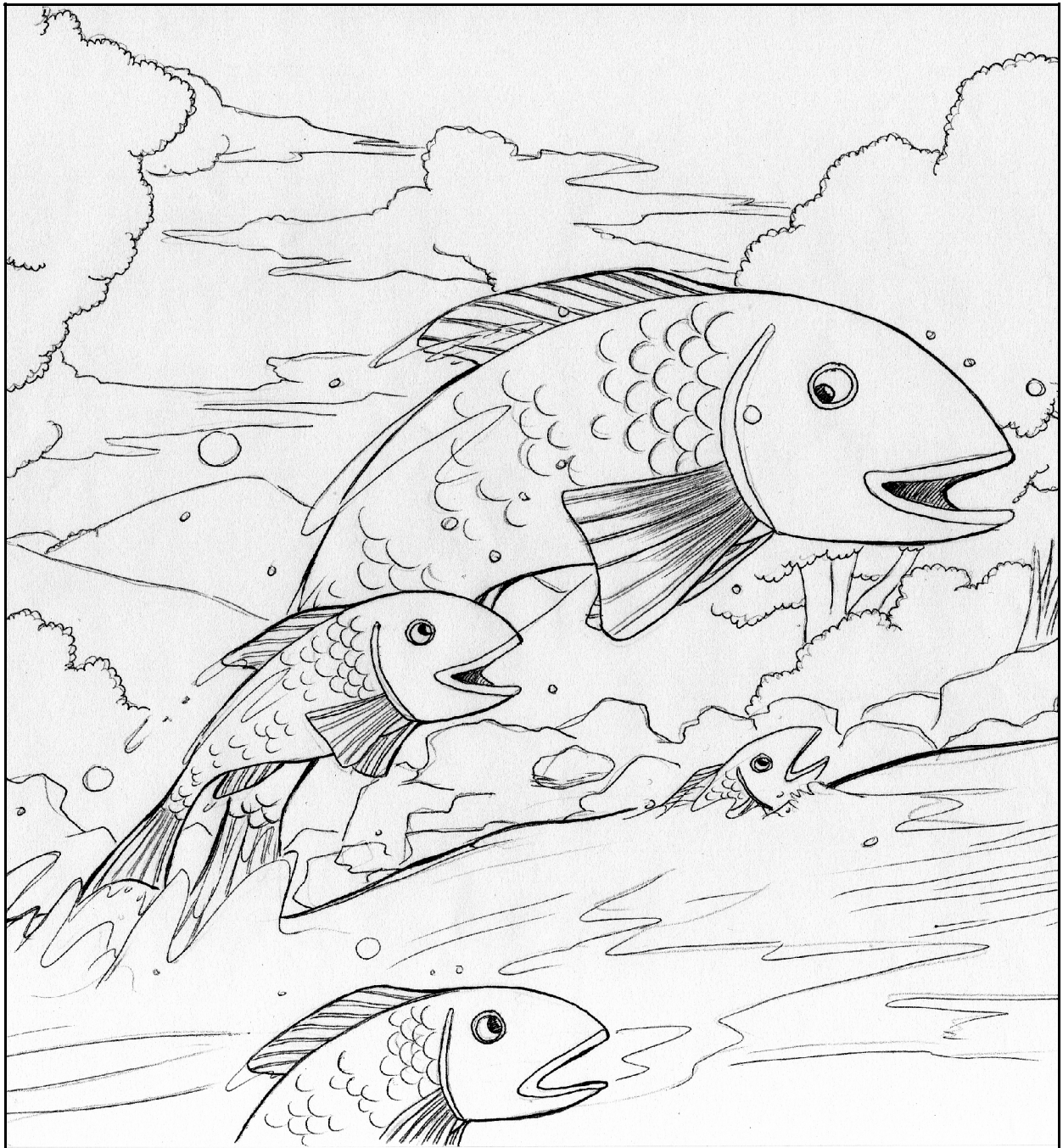

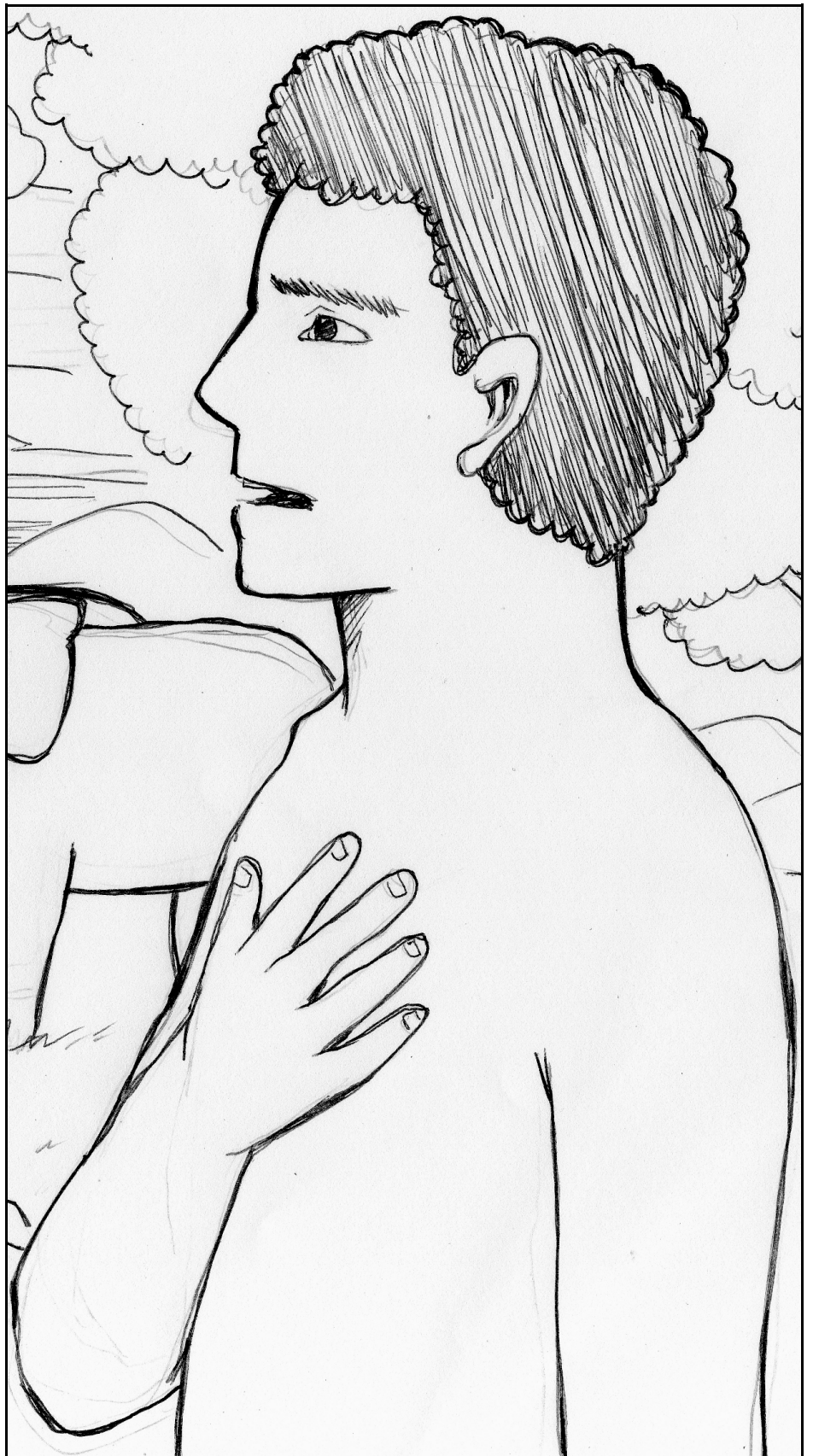

Deep inside, something makes them desire to swim and press through strong and hard obstacles to make it to the springs where their babies can survive.



The more Adam watched all the creatures as he named them, the more lonely he became. All the animals had someone that was the same kind. Each day he felt more lonely until he ached deep inside. Adam tried to not be lonely, but none of the animals were just like him, and he was so alone.

Adam wanted someone that could really be with him because they had his same nature. He longed for someone who could understand his heart and have his same desires. Adam knew deep inside that he needed someone that was after his kind.



Adam was feeling what God feels. God wants those that are after His kind too. God longs for people who deep inside have the same nature, instincts and heart that He has. God wants a family that is just like Him with His Life inside of them so that they naturally do what He does!

Just like the pigs have one kind of nature, and the salmon have their kind of nature, Jesus has His kind of nature also. Jesus has the nature that is above all other natures, so it is called the "divine nature". Jesus' divine nature is described as a lamb because He always lays down His life for others. God's divine nature is self-giving love. Jesus' heart always goes in the way of love for others, just like when He died on the Cross for us. No one has to force or command Jesus to love like this. It is so big in His heart to do this that He cannot go another way. It is natural for Jesus to not be selfish. It is easy for Him to love His enemies. Just like birds know to fly south, bears want to sleep through the winter, and salmon naturally swim upstream, Jesus loves and lays His life down for others.

Jesus wants to have a family that is just like Him on the inside! Greater than us working hard or trying to act good, God wants to put the nature of Jesus, the Lamb nature, inside of everyone! All we have to do is ask Jesus to come and live inside of our hearts! With Jesus Himself in us, we will become just like Him because His nature will be inside of us!
