
How Can We Give Jesus Rest?

It is a thought that our prayers and intercessions go beyond getting something from Jesus.

It is a thought about His needs. Because we know Jesus is God we assume there are no needs because God has no needs...but He does. He has desires and He has things that please His heart.



I would speak from my heart into His heart.



I know that we all pray, and I know that He hears all of our prayers. And I know that He is so faithful, but what if prayers were not really meant to be religious in nature, what if they were really just meant to be us talking to God? More specifically ... talking from my heart into His heart. I saw a little article that was entitled; "Five things that you can ask your Father that will make his day on Father's day". And basically they were either doing something special for him or talking from the child's heart, whether the child was young or old. I thought, a lot of times we really don't just tell Him our heart, and I am not just talking about our fears. We tell Him those! But I am talking about the things that we care about, or just asking Him what He cares about. And saying, "Lord I know that You may not be able to communicate those things to me right now, but Your Spirit is in me and on me. Holy Spirit, break through my world centered, my ME world, my earth world, the world and realm of my existence that my focus could be on His needs.

We start straying a little bit when we say, "Make my heart beat with Yours" because that is about us again.

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I would bring what little strength the weak can offer to the great.



I would give what little strength the weak can offer to the great. He is the great, and so we assume that because we are the weak that we are unable to minister to Him. But can't the weak sometimes think, "Is there anything this weak vessel can give to the great that would bless You, Lord?" I would give what little strength the weak can offer to the great. I use the word "strength" because I was thinking in terms of "rest"... what I can do to help lift the load. What I can do to cover Him. What I can do to say, "Abide with me and I am going to be a shelter for You". Abide with me. That is what they said in the gospel of Luke, "Abide with us, we will be a shelter for You" (Luke 24:29). cover You. We will give You rest. We will allow You rest instead of getting the Word, gathering it up, and then everyone going to their own houses while Iesus is left alone at the Mount of Olives to spend the night there.

I would love Him.



I did not say I would tell Him I love Him, although that is fine and there is no problem there, I am sure that is good. But I would love Him. I would just love Him. And I believe that if I just loved Him that would do more than all the teaching. In Luke 21:37, 38 if that was their first goal was to love Him they would have taken Him with them... "Come abide with us", instead of leaving Him out in the cold night to find a place to sleep in the mount of Olives. The scripture does not say that Jesus went to the Mount of Olives to be with the Lord or pray, it just says that is where He spent the night. If we love His teaching we may listen to Him and then leave and not even notice that He did not go home and was left alone. Yet if you just love Him you notice things. You go, "Jesus, nobody invited you home, come with me." God is love. That would be a wonder to Him, to be loved back, even if it was not as pure as His love because none of ours is.

Lord these are heart issues. Father, I don't know how to verbalize heart issues but in this session I was seeking to move the pendulum from off of us to Jesus. To draw out our hearts because we do love Him. To break open our heart as a vessel of ointment, as an alabaster box and just pour it on Him. So we ask You Holy Spirit and we ask You Father to help us to exhibit the things that are important. Help us to find Jesus in ways beyond teaching. And to love Him. To love Him. So we thank You Father. We thank You for Jesus. We thank You for giving us Jesus. We thank You Holy Spirit for giving us Jesus. In Jesus' Name, Amen.
