

Micah Class Four Questions:

1. What does, “Declare it not in Gath” mean to you? How does this reference to Gath emphasize the type and depth of mourning that 1:10 represents?
2. How does 1:15 bring us a clue as to God’s future hope for us after we fail to bring forth His Son?
“Yet will I bring an heir unto thee, O inhabitant of Mareshah: he shall come unto Adullam the glory of Israel”.
 - How does the reference to “Adullam” in this verse signify our part in bringing forth this Heir?
3. Micah 5:2 prophesies that Jesus will be born in Bethlehem. Among all the prophets, Micah alone is given the specific location of the birthplace of the Messiah. Bethlehem is signified in this verse as “little among the thousands of Judah”. In the account of Mary found in Luke chapter one we find strong words of encouragement for those who do want to bring forth the Son...
 - Why does God give Elizabeth to Mary for the first part of her pregnancy?
 - What does John represent in this portion of scripture?
 - What does the Holy Spirit represent?
4. Did Mary know the scriptures when she said, “Be it unto me according to Thy Word”? How can you prove your answer?
 - Can we respond in that same manner to God when we hear and receive the message of Christ in you the hope of glory?
5. What part does the Holy Spirit play in bringing forth the Son?
 - What is your personal relationship with the Holy Spirit like in regards to bringing forth the Son in you?
 - What part does the Word of God play in this relationship?
6. How can Mary and Elizabeth help redefine how we see and relate to one another?
7. Do we see the Father’s faithful care to provide a “support system” to all who are going to bring forth the Son. How is this true in your own life?
