
Conclusion

Introduction

Over the past years there has been a teaching going around that some have termed "the prosperity gospel". I am not writing this article to speak negatively towards anyone's beliefs, or the Lord's love and ability to care for our needs. I believe there is a very real part of knowing the Lord that deals with our faith in relation to God's provision in our practical and daily earthly needs. Glory to God and thank you Jesus! In general this prosperity teaching has mostly related to God meeting our needs, but my point here is that the emphasis of this teaching can go both ways! It is so wonderful to believe and trust in God's ability to take care of us, but how wonderful to think in terms of how we can prosper God and care for His needs! Just the realization that we can bless God in this way may be a radical awakening for some of us. Yet if we search the scriptures we will find that there are many places where it speaks of those who responded to the Lord in a manner that blessed Him and was concerned for His desires. Throughout both the old and new testaments we see examples of men and women who pressed past their circumstances, personal issues and even pain until they found not just the will of God, but the deep desires of His heart. We look at more of these examples later on in this article.

What a joy to know that we can actually be those who help meet God's needs! That we can care for Him and bless Him! Our hearts should rejoice at the thought of it! God chose to need us so that we could reciprocate His kind of love, a love that seeks to fill, to serve and to cover. God had to limit Himself in order to do this by becoming flesh and bringing us into union with Himself through His cross. Not only is God so almighty and powerful that He can miraculously provide for our needs, but He also humbled Himself, opened His heart and made Himself to need us.

Deep Cries Unto Deep

I believe there is a heart cry deep within every born again believer that knows we were created for the Lord Himself. The depths of our hearts respond to meeting the deep needs of the Lord's heart. He needs a body and we were made to meet that need. He needs a bride and we were raised up as His very flesh and bones to be unto Him one that loves Him and is after His same kind. There is only one problem with all of this... Jesus does not like to declare His needs or demand that they be met. He is self-giving, meek of heart, and a Lamb in nature. One must press past the veil of His outward power and glory to discover the deep longings of His heart.

How Can I Prosper God?

We may ask, "What could I give God that would bless Him and care for His needs"? Here are just a few examples to consider: We can give Him our hearts to dwell in. We can allow the Holy Spirit to deal with us and not resist His work so that Christ might be formed in us. We can humble ourselves before the preaching of the Cross rather than becoming offended so that a deeper work can take place within us for the Lord's increase. We can allow ourselves to be broken so that His fragrant Life can flow forth from us to others. We can give the Father His Son as we allow Jesus to live in us unto God. We can give God a temple for His presence to dwell in as we choose to be filled with His glorious Life rather than our own. We can give the True Vine branches that bear His fruit. We can give Jesus, the Head of His risen body, members that submit to His desires and

The Spirit of Our Gatherings

He Cares For Us... We Care For Him

Luke 12: 29-32 says, "And seek not what you shall eat, or what you shall drink, neither be of doubtful mind. For all these things the world seek after: and your Father knoweth that you have need of these things. But rather seek you the kingdom of God; and all these things shall be added unto you. Fear not, little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom". As we care for God's needs He will care for our needs so that all needs can be covered through love and not selfishness! We need not fear over our needs for our Father cares for us! Matthew 6: 8-10 tells us that the Father knows what things we have need of even before we ask Him. Therefore we can pray to our Father emphasizing His needs saying, "Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done in earth, as it is in heaven". We are free to think upon Him and give ourselves to care for Him even as He has given Himself to care for us!

Thou Art Worthy Oh God!

Throughout eternity there will be one central theme echoing in the throne-room of God, pouring out from the mouths of those who worship the Lamb forever. The book of Revelation captures this prayer for us so that we might hear the heart of eternal relationship and join in its chorus during this life, even now. "Thou are worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honor and power: for Thou hast created all things, and for Thy pleasure they are and were created" (Revelation 4:11). our own comfort first. We can feed the sheep He bought with His own blood by caring for others. Just consider how we would pray and pour out hearts before the Lord if we became as caught up in His needs and felt what He feels as much as we do for ourselves?

That I Might Know You

I believe the list we just mentioned is much larger than most of us would ever imagine. Yet rather than writing down every aspect concerning blessing God, our hearts should be moved to see Him in this way for ourselves. Reading a list will not impact us as much as discovering how our God feels from His heart directly. It is our love for Him that will make us want to press deeper into His heart until we know even His hidden desires.

There are times throughout the scriptures where God would allow those who were close to Him to experience things that would help them understand Him. He allowed Adam to feel the deep loneliness of not having one after his own kind. Joseph knew rejection from those he loved the most. God allowed Hosea to know what it feels like to have

an unfaithful wife. Jeremiah felt his own heart break over those who had forgotten and left God in their heart. Jeremiah cried God's tears. David yearned for God to have a house more than getting his own house. Beyond teaching, information or correct doctrine... these people knew their God from the inside out. They felt His pain. They were burdened with His desires. They lived to help make His dreams come true rather than their own. They existed to prosper the Lord.

The "Mary's" Who Cared For The Lord

A beautiful demonstration of those who tended to the Lord's needs is given to us throughout the Gospels. It is remarkable that the women who were most deeply poured forth in the Lord's care were all name "Mary". These "Mary's" ministered to the Lord in His death, burial and resurrection. What an incredible privilege and intimacy to be with the Lord in these times of great and eternal significance. What an honor to be able to share with Him and care for Him in these deep hours.

One Mary was with the Lord in preparation for His burial. This is Mary of Bethany (Martha's sister) found in John 12:3-7. This Mary anointed the Lord to prepare Him for His burial (verse 7). So much could be said about the incredible sensitivity and awareness this woman must have had to be able to understand the time of death that Jesus was about to enter into, and to be with Him in preparation for it. This woman was with Him, even when Jesus' own disciples were confused and afraid.

Another Mary is the Mother of Jesus. This frail vessel literally opened her heart for God to bring forth His Son

through her into this dark world. She heard God's Word and submitted her heart to His desire to bring forth Christ through her. She not only cared for God's desire in the bringing forth of Christ, but was also with Him when His Son was being crucified on the Cross. Jesus saw her, and spoke to John from His Cross instructing him to care for her. Mary beheld and stood with the Lamb of God as He gave Himself for us. All of the disciples except John had scattered in those lonely hours, but she stood there with Jesus and was with Him in His darkest hours. She suffered with Him, for Simeon foresaw how the Lord's sufferings would be like a sword piercing her own heart (Luke 2:35).

Our final Mary is Mary Magdalene, the first human to behold Jesus in His new resurrected form (John 20:1-18). She had been out by His tomb looking for Him when it was yet dark. When she found his tomb empty, she went and told the disciples who then came and looked. The disciples went back home but she stayed there outside the tomb weeping. She had no home to return to, Jesus was her everything. Jesus then appeared to her and told her to tell the disciples what had happened. She was the first human being to carry the message that Jesus was risen from the dead to mankind! This woman could not bear the thought of living without Jesus, and He appeared to her first!

These "Mary's" can show us that we have an intimate place with the Lord in His death, burial and resurrection. Even beyond partaking of the great work God did for us in Christ through His Cross, there is still a place for us to be with Him, even in these areas. As disciples we can find ourselves more sensitive to teachings or ministry, yet even now we can cultivate our hearts to become more in tune with the Lord Himself and His needs. Jesus needs His "Mary's"... His Bride!
